EMT CLASS OVERVIEW

Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT's) are employed by EMS agencies, fire departments, hospitals, and many other acute care clinical providers. EMT licensure is also the prerequisite for paramedic licensure.

This is a State of Michigan approved EMT program. Upon successful completion, students are eligible to take the National Registry exam. This class will consist of 221 hours of classroom instruction and 56 hours of field internship.

Field clinicals will be conducted at Medstar Ambulance as well as Henry Ford Macomb and McLaren Macomb.
